

**Middlesex Township Board of Supervisors
Minutes of the Regular Meeting
October 21, 2009**

The Regular Meeting of the Middlesex Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 6:30 p.m. Present were Chairman Alonzo Van Atta, Vice Chairman Mark Vincent, Supervisor Mike Spreng, Solicitor Michael Hnath, Manager Scot Fodi, and Secretary Linda Young.

Eric Urbanowicz, Overbrook Road, asked if the MMO payments for the pensions went up this year.

On a motion of Vincent, seconded by Spreng the Board of Supervisors approved the Minutes of the September 16, 2009 Regular Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

On a motion of Vincent, seconded by Spreng the Board of Supervisors approved Warrant List #011009 dated October 21, 2009. Motion carried unanimously.

Manager Fodi presented an update on the Earned Income Tax Consolidation meeting. They held an election for four officers for the Executive Committee. Manager Fodi was elected Treasurer.

On a motion of Vincent, seconded by Spreng the Board of Supervisors approved Resolution #17 of 2009 approving the 2010 Uniform (\$0) and Non-Uniform (\$10,581) Pension Plan Minimum Municipal Obligations. Motion carried unanimously.

Manager Fodi presented an overview of 431 Ridge Road issuance of a permit for an experimental on-lot septic system.

Mike Corle, SEO, stated that the system is not experimental; it is only experimental on this site since it has more than a 25% slope. The system has been installed in other municipalities. The only other option, if this system would fail, is a greenhouse system, which is not a standard system.

Diane Passoth, 441 Ridge Road, stated her concern for the experimental system going in next door. Her well is very close and could possibly be contaminated if the system fails. There are also abutting properties down hill from this system which are not aware of this system going in.

Mike Corle said that he would do the inspection of the initial installation along with the designer, John DeLacio. Mike Corle stated that the system is at least 100 feet from Mrs. Passoth's well. It still has not been determined who will be doing the inspections. Tamisa Smeider, DEP, recommended a third party inspector. Mike Corle recommended that the Board of Supervisors ask the Passoths to have their well tested at the expense of the mortgage company or the Township.

Diane Passoth said that they will cooperate with the Township in any way and would be happy to send in a copy of their well test results done a few years ago.

Supervisor Spreng stated that Central Drive is the last road to be paved and the road department has been back filling curbs.

Manager Fodi said that the Central Drive culvert is being installed and the project should be completed next week.

On a motion of Vincent, seconded by Spreng the Board of Supervisors approved McClymond's quote for 2010 Anti-Skid at \$11.45/ton. Motion carried unanimously.

On a motion of Vincent, seconded by Spreng the Board of Supervisors approved changing Brian Pappas, Road Department, from part-time to full-time status. Motion carried unanimously.

Conrad Pfeifer, Police Department, presented slides from the G20 Summit and thanked the Board of Supervisors for approving Sergeant Ruediger, Officer Davison, and Officer Pfeifer to participate. There was also one Officer from Buffalo Township, which made only 4 officers from Butler County. Officer Pfeifer commented that it was a great experience and was a good way to network with officers from other states.

Rosemary Brown, Lindo Lane, asked if Middlesex Township has a hazardous waste day.

Eric Urbanowicz, Overbrook Road, commented that he and Don Marshall will be running for Supervisor on November 3, 2009. He asked Chairman Van Atta to resolve the issues between the Board of Supervisors and Mr. Urbanowicz before he leaves office at the end of the year.

On a motion of Vincent, seconded by Spreng the Board of Supervisors adjourned at 7:52 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
