

**Middlesex Township Board of Supervisors**  
**Minutes of the Regular Meeting**  
**March 21, 2007**

The Regular Meeting of the Middlesex Township Board of Supervisors was called to order at 7:00 p.m. Present were Chairman Alonzo Van Atta, Vice Chairman Mark Vincent, Solicitor Michael Hnath, Manager Scot Fodi, and Secretary Linda Young. Supervisor David McMaster was absent.

The Board of Supervisors made a public statement regarding the accident involving Robert Maust at Holy Sepulcher School on Old Route 8 North.

On a motion of Vincent and Van Atta the Board of Supervisors opened the public hearing at 7:05 p.m. to consider proposed Township Ordinance #110 – Amending Article III, Mandatory Connections, of Chapter 134, Sewers and Sewage Disposal, of the Township Code.

On a motion of Vincent and Van Atta the Board of Supervisors closed the public hearing at 7:10 p.m. Motion carried.

On a motion of Vincent and Van Atta the Board of Supervisors enacted Township Ordinance #110 – Amending Article III, Mandatory Connections, of Chapter 134, Sewers and Sewage Disposal, of the Township Code. Motion carried.

Mr. Charles Nedz announced that he is seeking a republican nomination for Butler County Judge.

Mr. Richard Goldinger announced that he is running for District Attorney for Butler County.

On a motion of Vincent and Van Atta the Board of Supervisors authorized the Township Manager to advertise proposed Township Ordinance #111 – Amending Chapter 65, Construction Codes, Uniform, of the Township Code, modifying the application of the UCC International Plumbing Code as it pertains to Public Utility Connections. Motion carried.

The Board of Supervisors announced the appointment of Greg Clifford to the Saxonburg Area Authority Board.

Mike Spreng, Bowers Road, asked who would be doing the inspections on the tanks. Manager Fodi said Code.sys and himself. The Sewer Authority will send information to the Township on an on-going basis as to which residents have properly connected to the sewer system. The Township will send them a letter stating that the Mandatory Tap-In Ordinance requires emptying of the holding tank and filling it. They will be asked to provide the Township of their schedule, time frame, and how they plan on filling it. Someone from the Township will go out and verify that the disconnection has occurred and the tank has been filled.

Otto Wagg, asked how quick the inspector will be able to get to the residence. Manager Fodi commented that Saxonburg is responsible for how they are going to inspect the lateral lines. Code.sys has a significant number of employees also to help with the inspections.

Bob Ellsworth, Ellsworth Lane, commented that he lives on a private lane and asked if his road will be put back to the previous condition or better or will they just put gravel on it. It had a road base to begin with so what recourse would they have. Manager Fodi said that he would help as best as he can.

John Rusnak commented that Scot can work with the Authority up to the point of making a claim on the bond.

On a motion of Vincent and Van Atta the Board of Supervisors approved the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of February 21, 2007 and the Minutes of the Work Session of March 7, 2007. Motion carried.

Eric Urbanowicz, Overbrook Road, asked Chairman Van Atta if the only thing discussed in Executive Sessions is personnel issues. Chairman Van Atta stated that he already answered that question. Mr. Urbanowicz asked Vice Chairman Vincent if he would retract his statements made against him and apologize. Vice Chairman Vincent had no comment.

Cindy Knauff presented the Parks & Recreation Committee Meeting report.

On a motion of Vincent and Van Atta the Board of Supervisors adjourned at 8:07 p.m. Motion carried.
